This is a tale of a WUCC huli huli chicken sale where help from our Liliuokalani Church friends led to a fundraising success. The year was 1991, 29 years ago, and we had only been on our new church campus for 2 years. Larry Van Drei shared an article he wrote about the event. He asked me to rewrite it for The Beacon, but I'll let most of his creative, God inspired description speak for itself. Kathy Lee

"I, Larry Van Drei, arrived at the church grounds a little before midnight and found 5 or 6 cars in the parking lot. I saw shadowy forms back by the storage building. Who could they be? As I approached them, I realized it was John Hirota and 11 friends from Liliuokalani Church waiting for us. "Pop" the lights went on and bags of charcoal and boxes of chickens were carried out. The place was buzzing with activity but there were only 2 of us, Mr. Subia and me to 12 of them. The packaging ladies had not arrived yet, so early arrival Evelyn Miyata called them. They responded quickly and soon everything was in full operation. It was then, only 3:00 A.M. but we soon were quite a bit ahead of schedule and our work force now equaled that of John Hirota and friends. They stayed until about 4:30 A.M. and we gave them our heartfelt thanks. Because they gave of their time and energy so generously, we were able to get ahead of schedule. We would have had a long and exhausting day without them. God bless them and praise the Lord!

The dark, morning hours went by in a blur. As I

was walking across the grass to the kitchen, I was stopped by Florencio Andres. He pointed up towards the moon and remarked how two stars seemed to be near it. The moon was a bright thin slice with a bright star directly above it and another bright star directly below. It was a very pleasing sight. Isn't it written in the Bible that the Lord has given each of us a star?

From 6:00 A.M on, our regular crew kept the chickens dancing on the line. They did a great job keeping the machine full to the max with 80 birds. Needless to say, the ladies at the packaging tables and at the distribution point kept the operation moving smoothly. The finished product went out quickly. Meanwhile.

back at the fire, the guys and gals were working hard. Most of the time, I could

hear their friendly jokes, and their smiles were plentiful. All the time, we were getting more and more tired, but the older folks paced themselves so as not to run out of energy. The young folks never slowed down and never ran out of energy.

It was a feeling of relief when the last 80 chickens were turning on the machine. Finally, at 2:04 P.M., the last chickens had finished their dance. Thanks be to the Lord we sold all 1,878 of them.
