SERVICE TO COUNTRY AND GOD

As Veteran's Day is upon us, we acknowledge the men and women who have served and are currently serving this beautiful country. We are thankful for their service,

dedication and sacrifice for our country that was built on Christian values. As a father, I am thankful for the service Faith is providing to her country and the community. I can see her house building on solid rock like the wiseman. A young soldier with biblical principles.

When I got word, that Faith was graduating a year early, I asked her "What do you want to do after you graduate?" Of course, she wasn't sure, so I recommended some things, one of which was serving our country through the Air National Guard and going to school. Getting paid, while reaping the benefits of college tuition being taken care of, she really liked the idea and later committed to the 169th Air Defense Unit. Faith graduated from Basic Training on August 25, 2023 in Lackland, Texas. Faith's target practice with her AR15 in the mountains paid off, along with a little bit of mom's medical experience helped her as she led a team of hers as a Chief in a Tactical Deployment Combat Scenario in the last week of training. Faith was acknowledged for Combat Arms Tactical and Emergency Management; she graduated with honors with the max number of ribbons a graduate could get. One was for a marksman of her class, a skilled shooter indeed. Airman 1st Class Calaro was 1 of 5 basic trainees graduating with honors and she was the only girl out

of 700+ graduates. After BMT, she went off to Tech School in Louisiana for a couple of months, returned to duty on Oahu where she put in her hours to get qualified. After a couple of months on the job, Faith was offered a full-time Active-Duty position. A well-deserved position that holds a great deal of responsibility, a behind the scenes servant to keep our island and country safe, the eyes in the skies. Rewinding back to pre-screening and basic training, Faith recently gave a testimony titled "True North", sharing how we can lose our sense of direction but by using a compass we can find true North always pointing to the top. She shared a portion of how she was initially disqualified from her position weeks prior to attending Basic Training which was heartbreaking to hear. She felt defeated. Her former Jiu Jitsu coach, who stopped by

our house to pick up a bouncer for an event they had for their church event, Coach Noel and Coach Ryan Kauanui also serve in the Air National Guard and are active members of the Mission Church in Sunset. These guys have been our Angels in disguise. They helped Faith when she was bullied as a child and gave her the training and confidence to fight back when she needed to. Did I mention Faith has some pretty fast hands? She can throw combos with power behind them, she was training at CountrySide boxing with Coach Lui, a former Army Infantry Soldier, a man of God that would host bible studies during boxing classes that help the kids be men and women of God. Glad to have them as coaches, which helped Faith to pursue a 2nd chance in getting the job that she was deemed disgualified for. These coaches reminded us, there was HOPE. We requested a report for the disqualification and sure enough there were discrepancies noting that Faith had contacts when she actually had her glasses which they asked her to remove when doing the test. That was brought up and she was given a 2nd chance which gualified her and enabled her career to start. This reminds us that we have mentors on our side that can guide you and pray for you and remind you that there is hope. We have Godly coaches out there that can help you with your fight to move forward and become

the person God has called you to become. Those talks with God led her in the right direction.
