Aloha church family!



As you are all aware, we had a successful Candidating Weekend (April 13 – 14, 2024). We would like to report that Pastor EJ Ravago has been called to become the Full time Settled-Pastor at Waialua United Church of Christ!

Candidating weekend started off with a Meet the Pastoral Candidate Dinner at our Church Social hall on April 13, 2024. The evening started off with live music by WUCC's own "The Uncles Band" (Dave Basilio, Virg Basilio, Dale Andres, Edwin Ramones and Augustin Matutino).



It is always a treat to witness their professional singing and playing! This time gave those who arrived a chance to meet and chat with Pastor EJ and his wife JL. The members of the Pastoral Search Committee were so excited to introduce Pastor EJ and his wife to the congregation.





Vanessa Agsalda-Rosenbush kicked off the program with a warm welcome to everyone. Brittney Pasion-Almeida then gave a wonderful prayer blessing for dinner. During dinner we were also treated to a special song by Peter Matutino. To follow that up, a special Hula was performed by Cil Andres and daughter Chrislyn Andres. Their Hula was so elegant and Merrie Monarch worthy. While everyone was seated during dinner, Michelle Sagaysay introduced the history of WUCC video "A Heritage of Hope, a Legacy of Love" while the screen and projector was being prepared for viewing. Not only did the video share our history with Pastor EJ, but it also provided a renewed inspiration to our congregation by reliving the history of our storied past. Our church was built through the hard work, faith

and love of members that came before us. Allan Sagaysay introduced the Pastoral Search Committee members and then formally introduced Pastor EJ Ravago to the congregation. Being given the microphone, Pastor EJ shared more about himself and also fielded questions from church members. From Kupuna to Keiki, from long-time members to new members, great questions were asked and answered.



Chad Ulep closed the evening with a great prayer. Thank you to the Fellowship committee for helping setup the venue and also a big Mahalo to the congregation for all the delicious dishes that were shared for dinner!

Sunday service, April 14, 2024 was led by Pastor EJ Ravago. Pastor EJ's Children's Message of "Auntie's Recipe" gave the keiki a chance to hear directly from Pastor EJ. Scripture Lesson was read by Michelle Sagaysay (Philippians 1:8-14). Pastor EJ then gave his sermon titled "Confidence During Life's Detours and Disruptions." This gave everyone in attendance an opportunity to see and hear Pastor EJ deliver his message and lead us in worship. We were then treated to special music by Pastor EJ's wife JL Ravago during offertory. Her singing of "Trust in God" by Elevation was so powerful. Pastor EJ then concluded service with the benediction.

Immediately after Church service our Special Congregational meeting was held. Moderator Chad Ulep did the call of the meeting. Quorum was established and Pastoral Search Committee Chair Allan Sagaysay presented the Search Committee report. The motion to recommend Pastor EJ Ravago as the Settled-Pastor effective July 28, 2024 for a period of 3 years was then put forth. The floor was open for questions/ discussions. No questions came in and the vote followed. After tallying the votes, the results were shared with the congregation. Pastor EJ and his wife JL were called back to the sanctuary where they were greeted with applause as Moderator Chad Ulep announced Pastor EJ as the unanimously-chosen new Settled-Pastor of Waialua United Church of Christ.



Once again, this committee is humbled and honored by the opportunity to serve. Thank you for trusting our leadership. This is a task that we did not take lightly. Our committee spent countless hours of praying and discernment throughout the process. We are thrilled and excited for the future of Waialua United Church of Christ. We look forward to worshiping with Pastor EJ!






DEACONS NEWS

WUCC BEACH CLEAN UP

On March 24, 2024 the youth of WUCC organized a beach clean-up! We believed that the beach clean-up would provide a bonding experience for our community, grow our relationships, and most of all beautify God's creation. welcomes volunteers and applications from groups, organizations and individuals for projects including litter removal, bulky litter removal, green waste removal, graffiti removal, painting, landscape maintenance and invasive plant/vegetation removal at different locations throughout island. The Program supplied tongs, trash bags, and gloves, and reviewed safety rules, and regulations of cleaning the beach. The beach clean-up was held at Haleiwa Alii Beach Park which was followed by a fellowship and bbq on the shore of the beach! Our devotion was led by Aaron Agsalda. He spoke about the meaning of Hawaiian words and how important it is in the life the Hawaiian people to not only pray for God's assistance and having faith, but working hard to care for the land. For example, we must malama the 'aina take care of the land – take care of our people. He reminded us that it is our job to be God's shepherds and mālama his 'āina that he provided for us. "You take care of the land and water it. You make it able to grow many crops. You fill your streams with water. You do



that to provide for the people." Psalm 65:9. Meaning how we, the followers of God, should do our best to maintain God's beautiful gift to us for it will also care for us. This event had a great turn out! Around 17 people showed up to help with the beach clean-up. Our church community was amazing. Throughout the park we picked up different types of trash, from things small as



toothpicks to bigger items like a random metal pole. It was such a blessing to see our church family group together to help and do our part to mālama the 'āina that God gifted us. We surely must plan another event sometime this year and be sure to participate and join us!

picking up, and more vendors are coming!




prepared with over 1,400 eggs and lots of volunteers who put the eggs out all over the field behind the church. I'm pretty sure we had about 100 kids there,


